



Please read all information carefully before coming to the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection event.

INSTRUCTIONS:

*LIMITS: 30 gallons of liquid wastes, 75 pounds of solid waste.

*DO NOT bring dried latex paints to the collection. Do Not Bring Small Amounts of Latex Paint. How to Dispose of 1/3 Gallon or Less of Latex Paint:

Remove and discard the paint can lid. Set the can in a place where it will not be disturbed and allow the contents to fully dry and crack. Or, add clay-based kitty litter or other absorbent material until the can is half-full, stir, allow to harden 1 or 2 days, and discard in trash.

Do not put the lid back on the paint can. Trash haulers will not accept paint cans if they can't see the dried contents.

*DO NOT bring empty containers to collection facility. Dispose of in regular trash.

*DO NOT package waste in plastic grocery/trash bags.

*Waste Oil & Car Batteries are NOT accepted at this collection. (Contact service station or retailer)

*Propane tanks and cooking oil/grease will NOT be accepted at this event, for proper disposal contact Monroe County DES at <https://www.monroecounty.gov/ecopark>

PACKAGING AND PROPER HANDLING:

*NEVER mix chemicals together

*Materials should be in original containers

*Label all containers

*Place materials in cardboard box (to protect from leaking in vehicle)

*DO NOT place wastes in plastic trash/grocery bags

*DO NOT Smoke while handling or transporting your wastes

*DO NOT bring children or pets to collection site

*Line trunk with plastic or newspaper to protect from leaks

*Package incompatible materials in separate boxes; i.e. pool chemicals separate from battery acid

If you have a leaking container place inside another container; i.e. leaking paint thinner place inside empty 5 gallon pail

*Secure materials in vehicles

ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS:

- *Pesticides, Fertilizers & Insecticides
- *Products that contain Mercury: Thermometers, Thermostats, Fluorescent Light Tubes, etc. (Compact
- *Fluorescent Light Bulbs should be taken to Home Depot for recycling)
- *Household Cleaners
- *Wood Preservatives & Stains
- *Oil based paints
- *Latex Paints: for 1/3 gallon or less (see note above)
- *Paint Thinners and Solvents
- *Chemical Drain Cleaners
- *Pool Chemicals
- *Photo Chemicals
- *Gasoline/Kerosene
- *Anti-Freeze, Brake & Transmission Fluid
- *Rechargeable & Button Batteries
- *Driveway Sealers (water & oil based)
- *Empty printer cartridges (business and personal)
- *Sharps/Syringes (needles): place in clear 2 liter plastic bottles and label with "SHARPS".

MATERIAL NOT ACCEPTED/ALTERNATE DISPOSAL METHOD:

- *Latex Paint 1/3 full or less
- *Propane tanks - accepted at permanent HHW facility ONLY.
- *Empty Containers - Dispose of in household trash or recycle.
- *Used Motor Oil - Contact service station or retailer. DO NOT contaminate oil w/ antifreeze or gasoline.
- *Asbestos - Look in the yellow pages under 'Asbestos Removal'.
- *Radioactive Materials - Contact NY State Health Department (585)423-8064 or (518)465-9720.
- *Smoke Detectors - Dispose of in trash or contact manufacturer.
- *Infectious or Biological Wastes - Call Hospitals/Medical Centers for information.
- *Explosives/Ammunition/Black/Smokeless Power: Call 911 - Monroe County Sheriff's Department
- *Shock Sensitive Materials - (i.e. crystallized ethers, picric acid): Call 911 - Monroe County Sheriff's Department .
- *Pharmaceutical Wastes are NOT Accepted at this location. Monroe County offers safe free disposal of unwanted, unused or expired residential Pharmaceutical wastes at selected sites. For more information on this program go to <https://www.monroecounty.gov/ecopark>

TIPS:

- *Don't over-buy (buy a quart of paint for smaller jobs instead of a gallon. Ask paint sales person.
- *Whenever possible use up products as directed or share unused products with friends.
- *DO NOT allow latex paint to freeze.

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

- Devices containing mercury (thermostats, light bulbs, lamps, etc.)
- Household hazardous waste
- Devices containing refrigerant (A/C units, water coolers, dehumidifiers, refrigerators, wine chillers, etc.)
- Broken/bare CRT (tube) TVs or monitors
- Materials containing liquids
- Radioactive materials (smoke detectors)
- Devices containing PCBs (ballasts from light fixtures must clearly state "No PCBs")
- Gas powered equipment
- Large appliances (i.e. stoves, washing machines, dryers, dishwashers)
- Paper for shredding
- Loose or common household batteries (i.e. AAA, AA, C, D, button cell batteries)
- Damaged, defective, recalled, swollen, burned, or leaking batteries
- CDs, DVDs, VHS tapes, and cassette tapes
- Remanufactured/off-brand/generic toner
- Medical Sharps
- Vaping devices, E-cigarettes
- Propane Tanks (contents under pressure)

What to Bring to a Shred-it Event

Old Financial Documents

If not needed for taxes, anything with financial information should be destroyed.

Shipping Labels

Shipping labels can have personal information including names and addresses.

Photos

Photos can be stolen and used for fake identification.

Duplicates

If information is saved on a computer or another document, copies should be shredded.

What NOT to Bring to a Shred-it Event

Hard Drives

These require a special destruction process that will not be offered at Community Shred-it Events.

Batteries

Seek guidance from your battery's producer to learn about secure disposal.

Medical Waste

Attend your local Drug Take Back Day event to dispose of pharmaceutical waste and contact your local government to learn about other medical waste disposal options.
