On 3/1/26, officers were monitoring traffic in the area when they observed a vehicle swerving in and out of the lane and striking the rumble strips along the side of the road. Officers initiated a traffic stop and made contact with the driver. While speaking with the driver, officers noted the odor of an alcoholic beverage as well as the driver's slurred speech and bloodshot eyes. Officers administered several field sobriety tests before placing the driver under arrest. The driver had a BAC of 0.17% and was issued an appearance ticket as well as several traffic tickets.

On 3/2/26, the victim reported an unknown person in another state had used his name and other personal information to finance a vehicle.
