Reddick Ln **Identity Theft** **OGD-26-005314**

On 5/5/26, the victim came to the department to report that an unknown individual had hacked her email account. The hacker was able to access the victim's Walmart account and attempted to make an unauthorized purchase.

S. Union St **Customer Trouble** **OGD-26-005333**

On 5/5/26, officers were dispatched to a local business for the report of a known male and female causing issues at the location. The employee reported that they had asked the individuals to leave multiple times on numerous occasions for their disruptive behavior. Both individuals were located and trespassed from the business.

Hubbell Rd **Petit Larceny** **OGD-26-005611**

On 5/12/26, the victim reported someone had stolen about \$200 worth of property from his vehicle overnight.

Windsorshire Dr **Grand Larceny** **OGD-26-005674**

On 5/13/26, the victim reported she had found a page on Facebook advertising puppies. The victim contacted the seller of the puppies and was advised the puppy would be shipped to her address once she sent a \$1300 deposit via Apple gift cards.

On 5/13/26, the victim reported that an unknown person withdrew \$9000 from one of her bank accounts.

Slayton Ave **Petit Larceny Arrest** **OGD-26-005800 & OGD-26-005801**

On 5/16/26, officers were dispatched to the location for the report of a larceny in progress. Asset protection reported the male exited the store with a full cart, passing all points of sale, two days in a row. The product was recovered and totaled around \$500. After reviewing security footage, the male was identified and apprehended without incident. The male was brought back to the department to be booked and processed. He was later released with an appearance ticket as well as a trespass notice from the business.

Birdsong Ter **Forgery** **OGD-26-005880**

On 5/18/26, the victim reported he had mailed a check out for taxes and on his statement, the check appeared to be washed and made out to an unknown individual.

Union St **Petit Larceny Arrest** **OGD-26-005972**

On 5/20/26, the victim reported someone had stolen goods from his roadside produce stand. After reviewing footage from the stand, officers recognized the thief from previous interactions. The male was located after a brief search and brought back to the department to be booked and processed before being released with an appearance ticket.

S. Union St**DWI Arrest****OGD-26-006186**

On 5/25/26, officers responded to the area for the report of a two-car motor vehicle accident, where one of the drivers left the scene. While canvassing the area, officers located the male matching the driver's description near a gas station. The male identified himself to the officers and confirmed he was one of the drivers involved in the accident up the road. While speaking with the male, officers noted the male's slurred speech and the odor of alcohol on his breath, prompting field sobriety testing. The male subsequently failed the field test as well as the preliminary breath test. With the results of a BAC of .18%, the male was arrested and released with multiple traffic tickets and an appearance ticket.

Buffalo Rd**DWI Arrest****OGD-26-006362**

On 5/30/26, officers were dispatched to the area for the report of a reckless driver who had struck a vehicle and was then driving down the wrong side of the road. Officers were able to locate the vehicle and proceed with a traffic stop. While speaking with the driver, the officer observed the driver's slurred speech and an odor of alcohol coming from the vehicle, prompting the officer to administer field sobriety tests. The driver was unable to complete the tests, including a pre-screen breath test. He was placed under arrest and brought back to the department. Upon completion of the booking process, the driver was brought to the Monroe County Jail.
