Helmar Dr **Suspicious Activity Arrest** **OGD-26-008775**

On 8/5/26, multiple residents reported an unknown male was going door to door advertising services for a pest control company. Officers located the male and asked to see his solicitation permit, which he did not have. While explaining the town code violation to the male, he became irate and argumentative. The male was cited for solicitation without a permit.

SR 531/Union St **DWI Arrest** **OGD-26-008816**

On 8/6/26, while traveling on State Route 531, patrol officers observed a vehicle driving at a high rate of speed, weaving in and out of traffic without using a turn signal. While behind the vehicle, patrols obtained a radar reading of 87 MPH in a posted 65 MPH zone. Officers then initiated a traffic stop. While speaking with the male, officers detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the vehicle, prompting field sobriety testing. During the tests, the driver showed several indicators of impairment. The driver was detained and taken to the department, where he consented to a breath test, which resulted in a BAC of 0.11. The driver was issued multiple traffic tickets as well as an appearance ticket.

Noble Dr **Criminal Mischief** **OGD-26-008829**

On 8/7/26, the resident reported that a known female destroyed household items due to becoming angry at her boyfriend, who is the resident's caretaker.

Maplewood Ave **Petit Larceny** **OGD-26-008940**

On 8/9/26, it was reported that various prescription medications had been stolen from the residence. There were no signs of forced entry, and the homeowner reported that no unknown individuals had been inside the house.

Lyell Rd **Criminal Mischief** **OGD-26-009004**

On 8/11/26, a resident came to the department to report that someone had intentionally punctured the tires on his dump trailer.

Brockport Rd **Grand Larceny** **OGD-26-009118**

On 8/14/26, the victim reported he was involved in a phone scam where the suspect posed as a local banker. Ultimately, the victim was scammed out of almost \$16,000.

Buffalo Rd/Westside Dr **Hit and Run/Reckless Driving** **OGD-26-009211**

On 8/16/26, officers responded to multiple complaints involving a tan four-door sedan, including a hit-and-run at the Sunoco gas station and an erratic vehicle complaint on Westside Drive. Officers located the vehicle abandoned at a nearby residence and subsequently located the driver inside the house suffering from a serious foot injury. The investigation determined the driver had struck another vehicle while leaving the Sunoco parking lot and continued driving approximately one mile with his injured foot outside the vehicle. The driver was transported for medical treatment.

Slayton Ave	Petit Larceny/ Falsely Reporting a Fire	OGD-26-009369
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On 8/21/26, officers responded to the local business for a fire alarm. The investigation determined that a female suspect activated the fire alarm and forced open a locked vestibule door while a male suspect pushed a shopping cart containing unpaid merchandise out of the store. The suspects then loaded the merchandise into a vehicle and fled the area. The incident remains under investigation.

S Union St	Petit Larceny	OGD-26-009428
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On 8/23/26, the victim reported his bicycle was stolen from a bike rack located in an alley near the victim's apartment. The bicycle had been secured to the rack, but the bicycle was removed, leaving the front tire still locked to the rack.

Dresser Rd	Identity Theft	OGD-26-009482
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On 8/25/26, the victim came to the department to report an unknown person had opened a bank account using his information. The victim only realized this after receiving a welcome letter in the mail from the financial institution.

On 8/25/26, the victims reported that at some point during the evening hours, someone had broken into their garage and stole their garage door system.

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On 8/26/26, patrols were dispatched to the area for a welfare check. The victim's family member called police when she learned the victim was sending copious amounts of money to two unknown individuals. The victim explained to police that she had been in an online relationship with a famous country singer since June and had been sending money to them, totaling around \$9500. The victim then explained another unknown individual was posing as an Apple representative. The Apple rep instructed the victim to buy \$500 gift cards from various locations and then provide the numbers back to him. By the time police were called, the victim had purchased around \$8000 worth of gift cards.

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On 8/27/26, the victim reported receiving several welcome emails from various financial institutions for accounts she had not opened.

Shepard Rd	Menacing	OGD-26-009616
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On 8/28/26, officers were dispatched to a warehouse where it was reported that an employee pulled out a gun and showed it to another employee. Patrols approached the suspect and ordered him to put his hands in the air; he was then taken into custody without incident. Officers seized the handgun, which was determined to be a Glock-style BB gun after further investigation.
